#### The Other Cyclorama

Sue Boardman is a native of Danville, Pennsylvania. She graduated with honors from Geisinger Medical Center School of Nursing and Pennsylvania State University. Sue worked as an Emergency Room nurse for 23 years. In 2000, she became a Licensed Battlefield Guide and received the Superintendent's Award for Excellence in Guiding in 2005 and 2006. In 2002, Sue joined the Gettysburg Foundation's Museum Design Team during the project to build the new museum and visitor center complex.

Sue served as research historian for the Gettysburg Cyclorama conservation project. She authored the book *The Battle of Gettysburg Cyclorama: A History and Guide* and *The Gettysburg Cyclorama: The Turning Point of the Civil War on Canvas.* Sue has also published the book *Elizabeth Thorn: Wartime Caretaker of Gettysburg's Evergreen Cemetery* and several articles on the history of the American Civil War cycloramas.

Don't miss this chance to hear her compare and contrast two of the world's great cycloramas, hers and ours.
