Jim Auchmuty spent almost 30 years as a writer and editor for The Atlanta Journal-Constitution, specializing in stories about the South and its history and culture. He was twice named the Cox Newspapers chain's Writer of the Year and was honored by the Robert F. Kennedy Journalism Awards, the Associated Press and the Sigma Delta Chi journalism society. Jim has written extensively about food, co-writing two cookbooks and most recently *Smokelore: A Short History of Barbecue in America*.



A native Georgian, Jim comes from a long line of barbecue pitmasters and Brunswick stew makers. He lives in Atlanta with his wife, Pam, an editor at Emory University. His previous book was *The Class of '65: A Student, a Divided Town, and the Long Road to Forgiveness*.

Jim will make the case that barbecue, not apple pie, is the most truly American food. Barbecue was on this continent at least a century before the founding of the republic and is intimately intertwined with American history. He will talk about barbecue in the years leading up to the Civil War, during the war and in the years afterwards. When people talked about a barbecue back then, they didn't really mean the same thing we mean now. He'll also tell the back story of the most famous barbecue in Hollywood history, the Twelve Oaks barbecue in "Gone With the Wind."
