Our February guest speaker, COL Ty Seidule, Chief of Military History at the U.S. Military Academy, gave a very in-depth analysis of how West Point has dealt with its Confederate alumni over the years. ## **Gary Gallagher in March**

Our speaker for the March meeting, at the Capital City Club, will be Gary W. Gallagher, the John L. Nau III Professor in History of the American Civil War at the University of Virginia.

Dr. Gallagher is one of the leading historians of the Civil War. His books include *The Confederate War, Lee and His Generals in War and Memory,* and *Stephen Dodson Ramseur: Lee's Gallant General.* He has received the Laney Prize for the best book on the Civil War, the William Woods Hassler Award for contributions to Civil War studies, the Lincoln Prize, and the Fletcher Pratt Award for the best nonfiction book on the Civil War. And his scholarship is backed up by action. Dr. Gallagher was founder and first president of the Association for the Preservation of Civil War Sites and has served on the Board of Directors of the Civil War Trust.

Don't miss this opportunity, at a new venue, to see and hear one of the great Civil War historians and preservationists present his topic for the evening, R.E. Lee: A Modern 19th Century Commander.

#### **Directions:**

#### From the North:

Take I-85 or I-75 South to the Downtown Connector;

Exit the Connector at Williams Street (at the curve);

Proceed to the 4th Stop Light;

Turn left onto Harris Street;

Proceed through two Stop Lights;

Turn into Club on your left just

Prior to reaching Peachtree Street.

#### From the South:

Come up I-75/85 to Pine Street;

Exit and arrive at Peachtree Street:

Turn right and proceed to Baker Street;

Turn right and go two blocks to Williams Street;

Turn left and go one block;

Turn left onto Harris Street, and go through two stop lights;

Turn left into the Club. just

Prior to reaching Peachtree Street.

#### To Exit:

Turn left out of Club (one way street).

Left on Peachtree Street:

Go through three stoplights and left on Ivan Allen Boulevard;

Go through two stop lights and turn right on Williams Street;

I-75/85 North is straight ahead, and I-75/85 South veers to the right.

#### Once there...

Registration is on 2nd floor (take elevator or stairs).
