Tom Clemens: Ezra Carman and Antietam

Our speaker in May will be Dr. Thomas G. Clemens, a foremost historian of the Maryland Campaign. He has spent more than two decades studying the campaign and editing and richly annotating the exhaustively written manuscript of Ezra Carman.

One of the campaign's participants was Ezra A. Carman, the colonel of the 13th New Jersey Infantry. After the horrific fighting of September 17, 1862, he recorded in his diary that he was preparing "a good map of the Antietam bat-tle and a full account of the action." The project became the most significant work of his life.

From hundreds of veterans' accounts, thousands of letters, and dozens of maps, Carman wrote an 1,800-page manuscript on the campaign, from its start in northern Virginia through McClellan's removal from command in November 1862. It is the finest treatment of the campaign ever written.

Don't miss this chance to hear Dr. Clemens and an in-depth review of this pivotal battle.

150 years ago

- 6 May 1861: Arkansas votes to leave the Union.
- **20 May 1861:** North Carolina delegates to the Secession Convention vote to leave the Union.
- **21 May 1861:** The Confederate Congress moves the capital from Montgomery to Richmond.
- **24 May 1861:** Col. Elmer Ellsworth is killed at the Marshall House in Alexandria after removing a Confederate flag. Considered the first officer killed in the war.
- **26 May 1861:** Federal blockades were set up at Mobile by the USS Powhatan and at New Orleans by the USS Brooklyn.
