Kent Masterson Brown: The Civil War: Kentucky's Mercurial Political Experience

Our speaker for September will be Kent Masterson Brown. He will speak to us on Kentucky's political situation during the war.

Mr. Brown was the creator and first editor of the magazine, *The Civil War*. He is the author of several books, including, *Retreat from Gettysburg: Lee, Logistics and the Pennsylvania Campaign, Cushing of Gettysburg: The Story of a Union Artillery Commander, and The Civil War in Kentucky: Battle for the Bluegrass State.*

Mr. Brown is also engaged in the production of Civil War and historical documentary films. His first documentary was *The Long Road Back to Kentucky*, His most recent productions are, *Retreat From Gettysburg*, and *Bourbon and Kentucky: A History Distilled*.

Mr. Brown was the first Chairman of the Gettysburg National Military Park Advisory Commission, as well as the first Chairman of the Perryville Battlefield Commission, He has also received numerous awards for his work in Civil War history and preservation.

Allatoona Pass Battlefield Tour

The Activities Committee has announced the first battlefield tour of the new campaign year. We will go to Allatoona Pass Battlefield, site of one of the bloodiest battles of the entire Civil War. The battlefield and town are still much the same as in 1864. Walk thru a star fort, a redoubt, extensive trenches and outworks that are still intact above railroad cut. The tour will be on Saturday, October 1, during the 147th anniversary weekend with living history and activities. State Ranger and Interpretive Historian James Wooten will lead our tour beginning at 9:00 am. There will only be 45 spots available so this will be for members only. This will be a 90 minute tour with a mile of walking on each side of the pass. A \$10 on site donation is requested for each person to benefit preservation of the battlefield.
