Failure in the Saddle - Nathan Bedford Forrest, Joe Wheeler, and the Confederate Cavalry in the Chickamauga Campaign

David Powell to Receive The Richard Barksdale Harwell Award

The recipient of our book award, David A. Powell, is a graduate of the Virginia Military Institute with a BA in history. While he has published numerous articles of different battles, for the past decade, his focus has been on the battle of Chickamauga. His latest book is Failure In The Saddle: Nathan Bedford Forrest, Joe Wheeler, and the Confederate Cavalry In the Chickamauga Campaign. The Confederate cavalry has enjoyed a storied and favorable history of its daring exploits during the Civil War, however, sometimes the romance evoked obscures the history.

Despite the presence of two Southern cavalry corps under legendary commanders Nathan Bedford Forrest and Joe Wheeler, Union troops crossed the Tennessee River unopposed, and turned Bragg's left flank. Threatened with the loss of the railroad, Bragg had no choice but to retreat and lost Chattanooga without a fight. When Bragg struck back at Chickamauga, he was once again surprised by the position of the Although Chickamauga was a Union army. Southern victory, Federal counterblows reversed all that had been so dearly purchased.

David's book is an attempt to determine what role the Confederate cavalry played in both the loss of Chattanooga and the staggering number of miscues that followed up to, through, and beyond the battle at Chickamauga. Failure in the Saddle offers new perspectives on the role of the Rebel horsemen in every combat waged during this long and bloody campaign and, by default, a fresh assessment of the generalship of Braxton Bragg.

150 years ago

- 1 November 1861: George McClellan promoted to General-in-Chief
- 7 November 1861: Battle of Port Royal: Union naval forces under Flag Officer Samuel DuPont secure an inlet between Charleston and Savannah including Hilton Head
- **7 November 1861:** Battle of Belmont: U. S. Grant [US] defeats Gideon Pillow [CS]. Grant's men are then routed by B. F. Cheatham [CS].
- **7 November 1861:** British mail packet Trent, carrying Confederate commissioners to London and Paris, is halted in the Bahama Channel by the U.S. warship *San Jacinto*.
