Forgotten History: The Battle of Port Royal

David Powell in November

David Powell, the recipient of our 2011 Richard B. Harwell Book Award, gave those assembled an excellent program on the roles of the Confederate cavalry of Gen. Forrest and Gen. Wheeler in the Battle of Chickamauga. His long interest in this battle has given him a depth of knowledge that was evident both in his book and in his presentation.

Dr. Stephen Wise to Speak on Battle of Port Royal

Dr. Stephen R. Wise is the director of the museum and the Cultural Resource Manager for the Marine Corps Recruit Depot located at Parris Island, South Carolina. He also teaches history as an adjunct professor at the Beaufort campus of the University of South Carolina, serves as an advisor to the South Carolina Battleground Preservation Trust and the Beaufort County Historical Society.

Dr. Wise will speak on the Battle of Port Royal, one of the earliest amphibious operations of the American Civil War, in which a U.S. Navy fleet commanded by Flag Officer Samuel du Pont and U.S. Army expeditionary force overwhelmed the Confederate defenders at the two forts guarding Port Royal Sound, located between Savannah and Charleston on November 7, 1861.

Be there to hear Dr. Wise discuss this event not often considered a headline event, but none the less a very important one the overall strategy and conduct of the war.

150 years ago

- **7 December 1861:** Stonewall Jackson destroys the West Virginia side of Dam Number 5 on the Potomac River, disrupting the C&O Canal and impacting the Union's ability to repair the B&O Railroad.
- **13 December 1861:** Battle of Camp Allegany, West Virginia.
- 21 December 1861: Abraham Lincoln signs a bill creating the Navy Medal of Honor, America's first medal. It is to be presented to sailors or marines who "...distinguish themselves by their gallantry and other seamanlike qualities..."
