150 Years Ago

- **3 August 1861:** Off the coast of Virginia a Union naval officer ascends in a tethered balloon to look at Confederate controlled Hampton Roads. It is the first balloon ascent from a ship in naval history.
- **10 August 1861:** Battle of Wilson's Creek [US] Battle of Springfield [CS]. Brigadier General Nathaniel Lyon [US] is killed in the Confederate victory.
- **21 July 1861:** First Manassas [CS], First Bull Run [US] About 25 miles southwest of Washington the first major battle of the Civil War pits Irvin McDowell [US] against P. G. T. Beauregard [CS] and Joe Johnston [CS].
- **22 July 1861:** George B. McClellan [US] ordered to Washington to take command of the Army of the Potomac following the defeat at Bull Run.
