The Civil War in Georgia

John Inscoe published The Civil War in Georgia last vear with UGA Press. It consists of articles on the war and post-war experience as drawn from the on-line New Georgia Encyclopedia, where he serves as editor. John will discuss how we understand the war differently during the Sesquicentennial than we did during Centennial, how the scholarship on the war has evolved in a variety of new directions since then, and how the content of this collection reflect current areas of interest and interpretation. He will also make the case that Georgia has perhaps the most varied and most pervasive post-war legacies of any southern state, a legacy that extends through much of 20th century and into our own time.

John is University Professor and Albert B. Saye Professor of History at the University of Georgia. He is a North Carolina native, educated at Davidson College and UNC-Chapel Hill. He served as the editor of the *Georgia Historical Quarterly* for fifteen years and since 2000, has served as editor of *The New Georgia Encyclopedia* on-line and as Secretary-Treasurer of the Southern Historical Association. His scholarly interests focus on Southern Appalachia, the Civil War, and southern race relations. He is the author or editor of ten books
