An Army Reborn: Lee and His Army From Seven Days to Gettysburg

Terry Winschel delivered a great program to those asson the Battle of Champions Hill at our April meeting. His description and analysis of this key event during Grant's Vicksburg campaign was exceptionally well done. His research and the maps he has developed were of the first order. An Army Reborn: Lee and His Army From Seven Days to Gettysburg

At our May meeting we will honor author, Jeffry Wert, with our Richard Barksdale Harwell Award for his book, *A Glorious Army: Robert E. Lee's Triumph*, 1862-1863.

Jeffry, a former high-school history teacher and a renowned scholar of the Civil War, is he author of nine books on Civil War topics and frequent speaker at our Round Table. In his latest work he focuses on the bold moves made by Robert E. Lee and the Army of Northern Virginia during the period from June 1862 to July 1863. At the outset of his command Lee suffered from the public perception that he was timid and afraid to fight. That aura was immediately dispelled by Lee during the Seven Days Battles outside of Richmond when with bold action he drove McClellan's army from the outskirts of Richmond. His audacious tactics continued his legendary rise in command and increased the fame of his army with the battles of Antietam and Chancellorsville where he fought armies nearly twice the size of his own. After Gettysburg where Lee's tactics proved disastrous and with his officer corps decimated, he never again regained the momentum he had enjoyed during the time since the Seven Days.

Wert states the book's thesis succinctly in the volume's last sentence: "No American army, against such odds and in less than a year, compiled such a record as that of the Army of Northern Virginia, and none altered the direction of the conflict more."

Don't miss his chance to hear a true expert and scholar on the war as we award him our coveted book award.

The weather also held out nicely for the members.
