Jeffry Wert in May

Our May speaker, Jeffry Wert, received our Harwell Award for his work *A Glorious Army: Robert E. Lee's Triumph, 1862-1863.* He gave an excellent overview on R.E. Lee's exploits from the Seven Days through Gettysburg when Lee and his army were at their peak. Our thanks to Mr. Wert for an excellent program.

September Suspense: Lincoln's Union in Peril

Dennis E. Frye is the Chief Historian at Harpers Ferry National Historical Park. Writer, lecturer, guide, and preservationist, Dennis is a prominent Civil War historian. Dennis also is one of the nation's leading Civil War battlefield preservationists. He is co-founder and a former president of today's Civil War Trust, from whom he received the Trust's highest honor - the Shelby Foote Award.

Dennis also is a well-known author, with 88 articles and eight books. Harpers Ferry Under Fire (released in March 2012) received the national book of the year award from the Association of Partners for Public Lands; and September Suspense: Lincoln's Union in Peril, was awarded the 2012 Laney Book Prize for distinguished scholarship and writing on the military and political history of the war. In 1862, the United States had been ripped apart by a civil war entering its 18th month. Until now, few have understood how close this breach was to becoming a permanent fixture on the map of history. It was the nation's, and Mr. Lincoln's, most trying month, as Gen. Robert E. Lee invaded Union soil, panicking entire cities. destroying fragile political alliances and causing all of the North to rethink the fight and question whether it was best to redouble its war efforts or give up and let the South pursue its own course. For three weeks in September, the air was electric, nerves were at the breaking point and the whole of the North held its breath. In this fascinating work, Dennis Frye draws from a voluminous cache of period newspapers to expertly demonstrate just how fragile the national bond had become by the autumn of 1862.

150 Years Ago

- **3 June 1863:** Robert E. Lee begins moving the Army of Northern Virginia, encamped near Fredericksburg, west towards the Shenandoah Valley
- 9 June 1863: Battle of Brandy Station Largest cavalry battle on American soil pitted Alfred Pleasonton [US] against Jeb Stuart [CS].
- 17 June 1863: Henry Halleck issues an order making George Meade commander of the Army of the Potomac, replacing Joe Hooker.
- **27 June 1863:** The CSS Atlanta, an ironclad in Warsaw Inlet, engages the USS Weehawken and USS Nahant before surrendering




