The Battle of Shiloh

Jim Lewis in December

Jim Lewis, Park Ranger and Historian at the Stones River National Battlefield Park presented an in depth analysis of the Battle of Stones River (Murfreesboro). His comments were tied to an excellent set of maps done by Ed Bearss in the 1960's. Tim Smith - Shiloh

Dr. Timothy Smith, author and historian, will be our speaker at the January meeting. He wi;; speak on the Battle of Shiloh. Dr. Smith, Civil War author and historian, is a native of Mississippi but now teaches history at the University of Tennessee at Martin.

Pursuing his love of history, Dr. Smith served as a Ranger at the National Park Service at the Shiloh National Military Park for seven years, where his interest in the Civil War was intensified. His main area of interest and specialty, besides the Civil War, is the history of Civil War battlefield preservation.

Dr. Smith has authored several books, including Champion Hill: Decisive Battle for Vicksburg, Shiloh and the Western Campaign of 1862, This Great Battlefield of Shiloh: History, Memory, and the Establishment of a Civil War National Military Park, 2004; The Untold Story of Shiloh: The Battle and the Battlefield, 2006; and The Golden Age of Battlefield Preservation: The Establishment of America's First Five Civil War Military Parks, 2008;

At present, Smith is working on a history of Chickamauga and Chattanooga National Military Park as well as a study of the home front in Civil War Mississippi for the Heritage of Mississippi Series published by the University Press of Mississippi.
