Twilight at Little Round Top

Robert E.L. Krick in May

Twilight at Little Round Top

Glenn W. LaFantasie, the Richard Frockt Family Professor of Civil War History at Western Kentucky University, was. He received his BA in History from Providence College, an MA in American History from the University of Rhode Island, and a Ph.D. in History from Brown University. He is the author, among other works, of Twilight at Little Round Top (Wiley, 2005) and Gettysburg Requiem: The Life and Lost Causes of Confederate Colonel William C. Oates (Oxford University Press, 2006). A collection of his published Civil War previously essavs. Gettysburg Heroes: Perfect Soldiers, Hallowed Ground, was published by Indiana University Press in 2008. He is presently at work on Lincoln and Grant, a book that will explore the relationship between the commander in chief and his general in chief.

For our program Glenn's topic will be one of the most celebrated firefights of the Civil War. He will focus on a five-hour segment of the three-day Battle of Gettysburg: the struggle for Little Round Top. His research has brought a new critical view and a wider perspective than many earlier historians, who have primarily fixated on the exploits of the 20th Maine regiment and its famous commander, Joshua Chamberlain. He corrects some of the mythology that's grown up around this unit. His view is that the 20th didn't run out of ammunition and that its climactic bayonet charge just hurried along a Confederate retreat-in-progress.

His knowledge of the hill's tactical centrality to controlling the entire Gettysburg battlefield, and of the Union and Confederate officers who led their units there will certainly make for and excellent program.
