President's Corner

Hopefully you are experiencing a pleasant Summer, and your business and enjoyment of life is becoming better rather than eroding. As we approach the beginning of our next campaign, we also approach the 150th Year following the "Late Unpleasantness".

In September, and timely as we approach the 150th anniversary, Emory Thomas will discuss advice given to both Presidents Lincoln and Davis before hostilities arose. The time period is 1860 and 1861, and is the topic of a new book Emory has either just finished, or about to finish. To the best of my knowledge this is a subject that has received scant attention in the past. The collective consensus seems to be, and has been. that the entire country, including its political leaders, was under a decided misapprehension as to the potential loss of life, cost and duration of any conflict, or that any conflict would ensue. Emory is a very good speaker. It should be interesting to get his take on this thinly discussed subject. Emory's past books include the Confederate Nation, and books JEB Stuart, and Robert E. Lee. He is a professor emeritus of Southern History at the University of Georgia, and has taught at the Citadel and other institutions.

The September meeting is when we recognize our past presidents, and hopefully Hank Frampton will be with us as his latest tour in Afghanistan is scheduled to conclude in August as I understand it. History sometimes repeats itself, as we know, and without any political or philosophical thought, the potential parallel between what was being embarked upon in 1861 in terms of analysis and longevity, and what we were embarking on in 2001 in terms of analysis
