War Dogs: 1861 and After

Emory M. Thomas is Regents Professor of History Emeritus at the University of Georgia, a long-time member of the history department faculty and the author of eight books That include Robert E. Lee: An Album (2000), Robert E. Lee: A Biography (1995), Travels to Hallowed Ground: A Historian's Journey to the American Civil War (1987), Bold Dragoon: The Life of J.E.B. Stuart (1986), and The Confederate Nation, 1861-1865 (1979).. He has written primarily about the Civil War, and his books on Lee and Stuart have been generally acknowledged as the finest one-volume biographies of Confederate Thomas was a member of the UGA faculty from 1967 to 2002, when he retired.

Emory M. Thomas took his B.A. with Honors from the University of Virginia (1962) and his PhD from Rice University (1966). He once taught Latin at the secondary level, played on what was then the longest losing streak in major college football, and defended Cincinnati and Dayton against the "Evil Empire" from 1965 and 1967.

Emory's topic for the evening will be "War Dogs: 1861 and After", a discussion of those on both sides that drove their respective nations to war. Make plans to be there.
