Second Manassas

Emory Thomas in September

Our guest and old friend of the Round Table, Emory Thomas, gave those assembled a great presentation on the "Dogs of War". His discussion of those who fanned the flames of war was both enlightening and entertaining.

John Hennessy to Speak on Second Manassas

Our speaker for October will be John J. Hennessy speaking on the Battle of Second Manassas. John is veteran Historian with the National Park Service and is an expert on the Battle of Second Manassas. He is the author of Return to Bull Run: The Campaign and Battle of Second Manassas, considered the definitive work on the Battle.

On August 28, 1862, in order to draw Pope's army into battle, Jackson ordered an attack on a Federal column in his front on the Warrenton Turnpike The fighting at Brawner Farm resulted in a stalemate. Pope was convinced that he had trapped Jackson and concentrated his army against him. On August 29, Pope launched a series of assaults against Jackson's position along an unfinished railroad. The attacks were repulsed with heavy casualties on both sides. At noon, Longstreet arrived from Thoroughfare Gap and took position on Jackson's right flank. On August 30, Pope renewed his attacks, seemingly unaware of Longstreet. When Confederate artillery devastated a Union assault by Fitz John Porter's, Longstreet's wing of 28,000 men counterattacked in the largest, simultaneous mass assault of the war. The Union left flank was crushed. Only an effective Union rearguard action prevented a replay of the First Manassas disaster. The next day, Lee ordered his army in pursuit. The Confederate victory was the decisive battle of the Northern Virginia Campaign.

Don't miss this opportunity to learn from a true authority about this major battle of the Eastern Theatre.
