Russ Bonds to Speak on "War Like the Thunderbolt"

Our January speaker will be our own Russ Bonds. In addition to being a member of the Round Table, Russ is the recipient of the 2007 Richard B. Harwell Award for his work, *Stealing the General: The Great Locomotive Chase and the First Medal of Honor.* His latest work, *War Like the Thunderbolt - The Battles for Atlanta*, will be the basis of his presentation this month. Russ brings a new perspective to the Atlanta Campaign, he moves beyond the strategy and the troop movements to tell the story of Atlanta and its people during that most trying time.

Russ is an in-house lawyer at The Coca-Cola Company in Atlanta and a lifelong resident of north Georgia. He was born in Atlanta and grew up in Marietta, just a few blocks from the spot where James Andrews and his men first boarded the General on the morning of April 12, 1862. Russ received a B.S. with honor from Georgia Tech and a law degree magna cum laude from the University of Georgia, where he was the Executive Articles Editor of the Georgia Law Review. He has published several articles and reviews on Civil War topics in national publications, including "Pawn Takes Bishop: The Death of Lieutenant General Leonidas Polk," Civil War Times and "Lieutenant Tecumseh: Sherman's First March Through Georgia, 1844," Civil War Times. He lives in Marietta, Georgia with his wife and three daughters.

Don't miss this chance to hear one of own and one of the leading authorities on the war in Georgia as he gives us his insights into how our city fought, fell and suffered in the Summer and Fall of 1864.
