Not Tell- Sex in the Civil War",
Dr. Thomas Lowry.

April Program

The April program will feature Dr. Thomas P. Lowry, speaking on "*The Story the Soldiers Would Not Tell - Sex in the Civil War*".

Dr. Lowry is a graduate of Stanford University, where he studied history and medicine. He has served in the U.S. Air Force and was on the staff of the Masters & Johnson Clinic in 1972 and 1973. His previous books and numerous journal articles are on anatomy and the history of medicine. For more than 35 years a physician and psychiatrist, Lowry is currently on the faculty of the University of California at San Francisco. His works include: *Confederate Heroines: 120 Southern Women Convicted by Union Military Justice* (2006); *Venereal Disease and the Lewis and Clark Expedition* (2005); and *The Story the Soldiers Wouldn't Tell: Sex in the Civil War* (1994). His book on Sex in the Civil War was recognized as recommended reading by the Library Journal.

This program promises to be quite unique on a subject that explores the private lives of Civil War soldiers and is seldom discussed in historic writings. You might want to leave the kids at home for this one!

March Meeting

Noted forensic pathologist and long-time student of the Hunley, Dr. Jamie Downs, gave a riveting presentation on the forensic pathology study he conducted on the Hunley and its final crew.

His mix of humor and scholarly knowledge coupled with his deep respect of the crew's dignity, made the program one of the more enjoyable of this year's slate. If the rest of the Hunley investigation is done with the same level

of care and caring it will be a first-class final result.

As a special item of interest, we had as one of our guests, Mary Elizabeth McMahon, a great-great granddaughter of Hunley crewman, James A. Wicks. Ms. McMahon is one of the few known descendants of any of the Hunley's crews.
