May Program

Once again we are fortunate to have the incomparable Ed Bearss speak to the Round Table in May. His subject this year is "*Chamberlain vs. Gordon: Who was the Greater Soldier and Statesman?*"

Ed was Chief Historian of the National Park Service prior to his retirement in 1995. He currently holds the title of Chief Historian *Emeritus*. Ed has hardly retired, however - he continues to conduct a variety of battlefield tours and is engaged in numerous speaking engagements and Civil War activities that keep him busy for over 200 days of the year! As engaged as Ed is in Civil War activities, writings, and preservation, less publicized is his service to this Nation as a US Marine in World War II.

Ed has received numerous awards for his work and dedication including the Bruce Catton Award, the Alvin Calman Award, the Bell I. Wiley Award, the T. Harry Williams Award and the Harry S Truman Award for Meritorious Service in the Field of Civil War History. He is a Fellow of the Company of Military Historians. In 2001 The Civil War Preservation Trust created the Ed Bearss Award for achievements in historic preservation and made Ed the first recipient.

As the son of a WWI Marine, Ed enlisted in the Marine Corps in April 1942 destined for combat in the Pacific with the 3d Marine Raider Battalion during the invasion of Guadalcanal and the Russell Islands. Ed also saw action with the 7th Regiment, 1st Marine Division, in New Britain. He was severely wounded at "Suicide Creek" at Cape Gloucester, New Britain in January 1944. Ed spent 26 months recovering in various hospitals before his discharge as a corporal in March 1946. Ed continues to personify the USMC slogan, "Semper Fi", in word and deed.

We truly look forward to an outstanding evening with Ed Bearss, one of our nation's national treasures!
