Faith in the Fight

For both the Union and Confederate soldiers, religion was the greatest sustainer of morale in the Civil War, and faith was a refuge in times of need. Guarding and guiding the spiritual well being of the fighters, the army chaplain was a voice of hope and reason in an otherwise chaotic military existence.

Our October speaker, John Wesley Brinsfield, Jr., is the leading authority on military Chaplains. He is the Chaplain Corps Historian at the Army Chaplain School, Ft. Jackson, South Carolina. He has degrees from Vanderbilt, Emory, and Yale Universities, and was a Woodrow Wilson Fellow at Mansfield College, Oxford. He has taught at West Point, the Army War College, and recently at Erskine Theological Seminary. During 28 years of active duty he has served in the Pentagon as well as during Desert Storm and Desert Shield.

He has authored or co-authored seven books including, *Faith in the Fight: Civil War Chaplains, Religion and Politics in Colonial South Carolina; The Spirit Divided: Memoirs of Civil War Chaplains - The Confederacy, The Spirit Divided: Memoirs of Civil War Chaplains - The Union, and Encouraging Faith, Supporting Soldiers.*

September Meeting

Kent Brown gave a fascinating presentation on the Confederate retreat from Gettysburg. His presentation of Lee's preparations for withdrawal early in the campaign were of particular interest. Special recognition was given to the Past Presidents of the Round Table and to David Vaughan for his outstanding year as our immediate past President.
