Our March speaker, Joe Glatthaar spoke to us on 'The Army of Northern Virginia' and interjected his presentation with interesting facts and statistics regarding Lee's Army from the Joe Johnston days through Appomattox.

Our April speaker is Gordon C. Rhea who travels from Mt. Pleasant, S.C. to speak to us.

A lawyer by trade, Gordon has also served with the Peace Corps, as an Assistant U.S. District Attorney and as Special Assistant to the Chief Counsel, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence Activities. Gordon is also a Harvard University Woodrow Wilson Fellow

He has authored numerous books for the LSU Press including: The Battles for Spotsylvania Courthouse and the Road to Yellow Tavern, The Battle of the Wilderness, Cold Harbor: Grant and Lee, To The North Anna River: Grant and Lee, Glory Enough for All, as well as for other prestigious publishing houses of Civil War tomes.

Gordon appears regularly on The History Channel, A&E Channel, and Discovery Channel in programs related to Civil War history.

His presentation on this topic should prove very insightful and entertaining.
