#### **Bud Robertson in November**

Another of our honorary members returns as the speaker for our November Round Table, James I. "Bud" Robertson Jr. is the recipient of every major award given in the field of Civil War history.

The author of the award-winning books General A.P. Hill; Soldiers Blue and Gray; Civil War! America Becomes One Nation; and the 950-page biography, Stonewall Jackson: The Man, The Soldier, The Legend, which won an unprecedented eight national awards, Robertson teaches the largest Civil War history class in American higher education--with approximately 250 students enrolled each semester.

Robertson is an Alumni Distinguished Professor at Virginia Tech, one of eight selected from the university's 2,200 faculty members.

The program Dr. Robertson will deliver will be, "Robert E. Lee: Virginia Soldier, American Citizen". This will be a look at the general from a completely different perspective than our book award winner earlier this year. This a program you don't want to miss.
