### **October Meeting**

Our October speaker, **Dr. R. Fred Ruhlman**, presented the round Table with an in depth analysis of the trial and prosecution of Captain Henry Wirtz as a war criminal for his tenure as commandant at Camp Sumter or Andersonville as it was more commonly known.

#### **November Speaker**

Tom Carhart will receive the Richard Barksdale Harwell Award of the Civil War Round Table of Atlanta for his book, <u>Lee's Real Plan at Gettysburg and Why it Failed</u>, Tom will also present the program at the November meeting on the subject of his book.

#### Richard Barksdale Harwell Award

Each year the Civil War Round Table of Atlanta confers the prestigious "Richard Barksdale Harwell Award" for the best book on a Civil War subject published in the preceding year. However, some members may not know who this coveted award is named for or how it came about. Having been familiar with the Civil War Round Table of Chicago, Richard Barksdale Harwell was responsible for conceiving the idea of a Civil War Round Table in Atlanta. In November 1949, Richard Harwell hosted a dinner at his home attended by Franklin Garrett, Beverly DuBose, Jr., Carl Forrester and Wilbur Kurtz to discuss the formation of a Civil War Round Table. As a result of that gathering, the first meeting of the Atlanta Civil War Round Table was held at the Piedmont Driving Club on December 10, 1949. Richard Harwell was issued membership certificate No. 1 and elected its first President. Prior to completion of his term, he relocated to Chicago to become the Secretary of the College Library Association. The award named in his honor was created in 1989, following his death on March 9, 1988, and has been awarded on an annual basis since.

The Richard B. Harwell Book Award Committee consists of Jim Bogle, Tom Watson Brown and Ron Hudgins. A list of previous winners follows on the next page.
